POSITIONING & MANAGEMENT

Cereal Rye (also referred to as Winter Rye) is a go-to option for cover crops planted late in the fall. Its ability to germinate and grow rapidly in cool weather, even below 40 degrees, allow it to establish good cover over winter, reducing erosion in addition to:

- Provide one of the best options for delayed planting situations
- Germinating and growing rapidly in cool weather, rye provides winter soil protection
- Being used for spring forage production or grazing option
- Improving soil from its extensive root system, which also reduces compaction
- Having an alleopathic effect on some weed species
- Mixing well with FIXatioN Balansa clover and Driller™ Daikon Radish

PLANTING RECOMMENDATIONS

- **Timing:** Late Summer or Early Fall, earlier plantings equate to more biomass production
- **Rate:** 60-120 lbs/acre drilled and 90-160 lbs/acre broadcast
- **Depth:** No deeper than 3/4" to 1"
- **Soils:** Adaptable to a variety of soils, tolerant to drought stress
